Updates from Bangalore Baptist Hospital



BBH Hospice 'Upshamana' Inaugurated at Devanahalli

On 24th September 2024, Bangalore Hospital (BBH) Baptist proudly inaugurated "Upshamana," a 50-bed hospice located on its Devanahalli campus. The ceremony was graced by Shri Dinesh Gundu Rao, Honourable Minister for Health and Family Welfare, and Shri K.H. Muniyappa, Honourable Minister for Food, Civil Supplies & Consumer Affairs. This momentous occasion also marked the expansion of BBH's palliative home care services into the districts of Kolar, Tumkuru, and Ramanagara.

The Upshamana hospice, the first of its kind in Bangalore Rural District, provides subsidized palliative care to terminally ill children and adults, with generous support from the Kurian Foundation.

What is hospice care?

Hospice care offers a dignified, comfortable environment for individuals facing terminal illnesses, allowing them to live their final days with peace and dignity. For many patients, especially those without adequate living conditions at home, hospice care provides a compassionate space that upholds their dignity and self-worth.

Hospice care, such as provided at BBH's Upshamana, is specialized care designed for individuals with a life expectancy of six months or less. Rather than focusing on curative treatment, hospice care emphasizes comfort, pain management, and emotional support, aiming to improve the quality of life for both patients and their families during this difficult period.

BBH Hospice at Devanahalli is distinct from hospital-based care, with its independent facility helping reduce costs by avoiding hospital-related overheads. This hospice complements BBH's rural palliative care project that began in 2015, offering affordable care in a serene and compassionate setting for patients nearing the end of life.



Hospice care includes the key aspects of:

- Pain and Symptom Management: Hospice teams prioritize the management of physical symptoms and pain to ensure the patient's comfort.
- Emotional Support: Counseling and emotional care are provided to both patients and their families to help them cope with the challenges of terminal illness.
- Holistic Approach: Care is centered on addressing both the physical and emotional needs of patients, promoting peace and dignity.
- Involvement: Hospice services also extend support to family members, including respite care, grief counseling, and guidance throughout the dying process.



BBH Express Healthcare in K Narayanpura Relocated

BBH Express Healthcare – K Narayanpura has relocated to a new facility at Esther Solitaire Properties, near Kristu Jayanti College in Kothanur. Officially opened on October 28, 2024, this 4,500-square-foot center spans two floors, offering evening clinics, physiotherapy, and other essential services. Plans are in place to add Ultrasonogram and X-ray facilities in the near future.

New BBH Express Healthcare Opened in Lingarajapuram



Engalore Rogarian Preserving Lives Since 1973

On November 6, Bangalore Baptist Hospital (BBH) launched a new Express Healthcare facility (EHL) in Lingarajapuram. Honourable Energy Minister of Karnataka, Shri K. J. George, inaugurated the center, which operates in a building provided by the United Christian Fellowship to support BBH's mission-driven outreach. This is BBH's second Express Healthcare facility, following the establishment of the first in Kothanur. "As a mission hospital, BBH has extended healthcare, training, and empowerment efforts beyond Hebbal, reaching slums and rural areas throughout Karnataka," Shri K. J. George stated at the inauguration.

Rev. Mary Shalini, Presbyter of Divya Shanthi Church, dedicated the facility to God's glory. Express Healthcare Lingarajapuram (EHL) offers outpatient consultations in General Medicine, Family Medicine, Paediatrics, Obstetrics, Gynaecology, and other specialties. The center also includes a laboratory, physiotherapy services, a pharmacy, and comprehensive dentistry.



Leaders' Training to Support Individuals with Suicidal Thoughts



A few days ago, one of our chaplains received an unexpected call from a local pastor. His voice was filled with gratitude as he spoke of the recent session BBH had organized on October 19th, dedicated to helping community leaders understand "How to Support People Struggling with Suicidal Thoughts." He shared how deeply the program had impacted him, setting off what he described as a "ripple effect" in his own life.

That following Sunday, the pastor gave a heartfelt sermon to his congregation, discussing how to handle harmful thoughts within one's life, family, and community. He spoke of the importance of

unity, compassion, and support when confronting these difficult issues. After the service, a young man approached him, eyes heavy yet filled with something new—hope. "Today's message changed my life," he confessed. "I've been seriously considering ending my life because of some personal issues, but your words brought a new sense of hope into my heart."

The 'Suicide Awareness and Prevention Program' had been

designed with moments like these in mind. Aimed at equipping pastors, c o m m u n i t y leaders, lay leaders, and others with







the skills to support individuals struggling with suicidal thoughts, the event was a collective effort by the Psychiatry and Clinical Psychology departments, along with the Patient Counseling Department and others. 140 participants joined that day, each gaining vital insights from the consultants and session leaders. The pastor's call was a reminder of the transformative power of such gatherings and the hope they can bring to those who need it most.

Janapriya Clinics: Reaching Out to More Rural and Needy Areas



The Janapriya Clinic, established within the hospital, offers affordable care with a consultation fee of just Rs. 30/- for the socially and economically

disadvantaged, drawing many patients. Recently, we launched a periodic clinic in Akkirampura village near Tumkur and inaugurated a new clinic in Chickajala. The Janapriya Information Centre in Hindupur continues to refer patients in need to BBH. Initiatives in Lazar Layout, Banaswadi, and Bhoopsandra are also progressing well. The involvement of a local NGO or social worker, along with

a designated space for these efforts, has been key to the success so far. Training programs and community empowerment initiatives are also planned for the near future.



One day, a neighbor told him about Jana Jyothi, an initiative by Bangalore Baptist Hospital (BBH) that offers free cataract surgeries for people who cannot afford them. With a glimmer of hope, Venketesh traveled to BBH. Welcomed with warmth and kindness, he soon learned he was eligible for the life-changing procedure at no cost. After his surgeries, he opened his eyes to a world restored—faces, colors, and light returning to him in vibrant detail.

Filled with gratitude, Venketesh resumed his life with newfound joy. But something more had changed. His daughter, moved by her father's story, felt inspired to pursue a career in allied health to help others as he had been helped. With support from the Janapriya team, she was able to secure an affordable spot in a government-subsidized program at BBH, marking the beginning of a promising future.

Before leaving the hospital for the last time, Venketesh returned to make a donation of Rs. 5,000, despite his humble means. It was a gift born from gratitude, an offering to help someone else see the world anew. His gesture embodied the true spirit of Jana Jyothi—a circle of kindness and hope, where lives are changed and gratitude flows forward to lift others in need.

Jana Jyothi Brings Light and Hope to Venketesh



In a quiet village near Chickballapur, Venketesh lived a simple life as a helper to a local cook, skillfully chopping vegetables for weddings community gatherings. But over time, his vision began to cloud from cataracts, leaving him unable to work as he once did. Faced with the steep cost of Rs. 21,000 per eye for surgery, he feared he would be forced to give up his work and independence.

A Testimony of Grace in Action

To address this issue, we will soon add a five-story building next to BBH emergency services on a lease basis, beginning from January 2025. To meet our urgent need for additional space, we have already leased one floor of this building to host various support services and classrooms, operational from October 2024.
